



Privacy Collection Notice

The Attorney-General's Department is covered by the *Privacy Act 1988*, including the Australian Privacy Principles (APPs). The APPs set out standards, rights and obligations regarding the handling and management of personal information. This includes how we collect, store, use, disclose, quality assure and secure personal information, as well as your rights to access or correct your personal information.

Further information about the collection of your personal information is provided below.

Statutory Review of the Crimes Legislation Amendment (Combating Foreign Bribery) Act 2024

The Attorney-General's Department (the department) is collecting some of your personal information to support the statutory review of the *Crimes Legislation Amendment (Combating Foreign Bribery) Act 2024*. The privacy and security of your personal information is important to us and protected by law.

The review is being undertaken by a review panel consisting of a representative from the Attorney-General's Department and the Australian Federal Police (AFP). Any personal or sensitive information you choose to provide may be shared with AFP representatives for the purposes of conducting the review.

How your personal information will be collected

- If you participate in the consultation by completing the online questionnaire or providing a written submission, you do not need to provide any personal information. If you do, this will be on a voluntary basis.
- If you email the department, the department will have a record of your email address, and if you choose to provide it, your name.
- Some consultation questions contain free-text fields. You may choose to provide personal or sensitive information as part of your feedback or submission to the consultation. If you do, this will be on a voluntary basis.
- We request that you do not provide unnecessary personal information or sensitive information unless it is directly relevant to your submission. If you provide personal or sensitive information about a third party, we will not publish this without the



consent of the third party, even if you have provided your consent for your submission to be published

If we don't collect your personal information

If we don't collect your personal information, it may affect our ability to get in touch, including our ability to contact you to clarify any aspect of the feedback you provide in the consultation.

If you choose not to provide your name or use a pseudonym, we may not be able to provide you access to information or records that you provide us as part of the consultation.

How your personal information will be used

We may use your personal information to consult with you, including to contact you if we have questions about your feedback, or would like to gain further information,

- to analyse submissions, including using AI tools, received through the consultation process
- to inform the statutory review of the Crimes Legislation Amendment (Combating Foreign Bribery) Act 2024,
- to prepare consultation summaries, reports or briefing materials.

Where practical, personal information will be de-identified before it is included in reports, summaries or other consultation outputs.

Who your personal information may be disclosed to

- If you include personal information in a written submission and provide consent to publish that submission, then your personal information may be published. For example, if you put your name on the title page of the submission or include personal information in the text of your submission.
- Your submission, including any personal information you choose to provide, will be disclosed to:
 - officers of the Attorney-General's Department involved in conducting the review
 - representatives of the AFP who are members of the review panel or otherwise assisting with the review.



- If your submission contains personal information or sensitive information about another individual, the department may de-identify or redact that information before using, sharing or publishing the submission.
- If you provide personal or sensitive information about a third party, we will not publish this without the consent of the third party, even if you have provided your consent for your submission to be published.

If we identify any other reasons, we need to disclose your personal information, we will seek your written consent before doing so.
